



Burgundy Wandering Jew

Tradescantia zebrina 'Burgundy'

Description:

This trailing perennial is grown for its foliage; striking dark purple and burgundy leaves have silver stripes and fuchsia reverses; low maintenance, and excellent for indoor containers or hanging baskets

Features & Attributes

Burgundy Wandering Jew's attractive pointy leaves emerge purple, turning burgundy in color with curious fuchsia undersides and tinges of silver throughout the year on a plant with a trailing habit of growth.

This is an herbaceous evergreen houseplant with a trailing habit of growth, eventually spilling over the edges of hanging baskets and containers. Its relatively fine texture sets it apart from other indoor plants with less refined foliage. This plant may benefit from an occasional pruning to look its best.

Planting & Growing

When grown indoors, Burgundy Wandering Jew can be expected to grow to be about 14 inches tall at maturity, with a spread of 3 feet. It grows at a fast rate, and under ideal conditions can be expected to live for approximately 10 years. This houseplant performs well in both bright or indirect sunlight and strong artificial light, and can therefore be situated in almost any well-lit room or location. It prefers to grow in average to moist soil. The surface of the soil shouldn't be allowed to dry out completely, and so you should expect to water this plant once and possibly even twice each week. Be aware that your particular watering schedule may vary depending on its location in the room, the pot size, plant size and other conditions; if in doubt, ask one of our experts in the store for advice. It is not particular as to soil type or pH; an average potting soil should work just fine.
